

## Ethics Scenarios

### **SCENARIO 1**

You've been supporting 20-year-old Sally for six months. Recently, Sally went through a difficult breakup and has asked to meet more frequently to talk about how she's been feeling. At your last meeting, Sally disclosed that she has feelings for you and asks if you'd be interested in going on a date with her.

### **SCENARIO 2**

### **SCENARIO 3**

She explains that she's feeling anxious about being around so many new people and asks if you'll come with her for support.

### **SCENARIO 4**

You've been supporting 16-year-old Trish for almost a year. For the past two weeks, Trish has been calling you 10-15 times a day to talk about the problems in her relationship. When you are unable to respond, Trish gets upset and accuses you of not caring about her.
